Program Timeline

2:00-2:05 p.m.	Introduce program. Show samples of projects.
2:05-2:50 p.m.	Participants will create Christmas ornaments— an angel, snowman or Santa Claus. One staff member will demonstrate the step-by-step process while two volunteers provide hands-on assistance.
	Step 1: Cut out a 1cm wide strip from each end of the toilet paper roll. Cut open the resulting rings and attach them as handles to each side of one end of the toilet paper roll using a stapler. Flatten the other end of the toilet paper roll and staple shut. Step 2: Select from red, white or yellow paint and paint the entire roll. Step 3: While the painted rolls dry, cut out pieces of felt or scrapbook paper in the shape of angel wings, a Santa hat, or snowman parts, depending on which ornament you are creating. Use glue to attach the parts to the painted toilet paper roll. Step 4: Use markers to finish decorating your ornament.
2:50-3:00 p.m.	Review display; encourage participants to borrow materials. Take pictures of participants with final projects (parent must sign a consent form).
